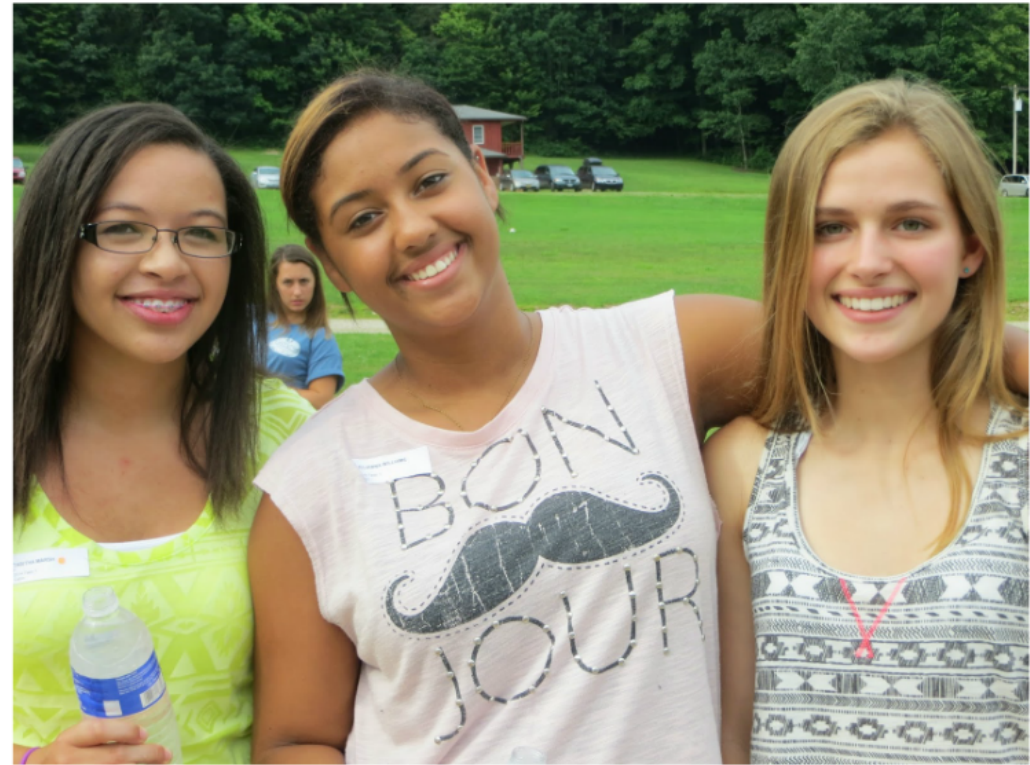

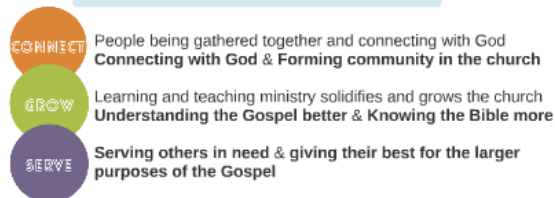
Identity practices:

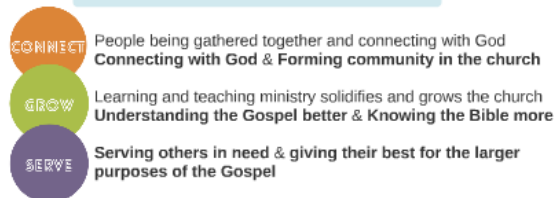
