Bigotry of low expectations


Poverty is the result of failure, and must be left to be overcome by individuals




This is not who the Bible is referring to.

Who knows best what we should do with prisoners of war?








The law we are seeking cannot replace the virtue we require.

Rejoice because...

Jesus doesn't play the world's games

(and most of what crushes the poor are the world's games)

1. Jesus accepts no games

(In the world's games the odds are all on the house.)



Jesus has a *worldliness* doctrine, not a *poverty* doctrine.

(see 1 Timothy 6, Luke 19)

2. Jesus does not accept the degradations of poverty in you.

(poverty isn't an excuse for spiritual death)



Two possibilities for "heavenly mindedness"

Luke 12:2-10

There is nothing concealed that will not be disclosed, or hidden that will not be made known. What you have said in the dark will be heard in the daylight, and what you have whispered in the ear in the inner rooms will be proclaimed from the roofs. "I tell you, my friends, do not be afraid of those who kill the body and after that can do no more. But I will show you whom you should fear: Fear him who, after the killing of the body, has power to throw you into hell. Yes, I tell you, fear him...

Luke 12:2-10 cont.

Are not five sparrows sold for two pennies? Yet not one of them is forgotten by God. Indeed, the very hairs of your head are all numbered. Don't be afraid; you are worth more than many sparrows. "I tell you, whoever acknowledges me before men, the Son of Man will also acknowledge him before the angels of God. But he who disowns me before men will be disowned before the angels of God. And everyone who speaks a word against the Son of Man will be forgiven, but anyone who blasphemes against the Holy Spirit will not be forgiven.

3 Hounds of hell pursuing the Poor:

- 1. Fear
- 2. Dishonesty
- 3. Hatred

Jesus' Good News:

1. Fear the one that can kill you AND throw you into hell.

- 2. Don't you know God sees you and that you are precious to him?
- 3. You have to tell the truth, or you'll truly die.

Applications:

- Believe the gospel—especially if you're poor.
- 2. Be heavenly minded in an emboldening way, not an intoxicating one.
- 3. Read the Bible on poverty—it's not that much

Applications:

4. It's healthy to be troubled about your wealth—are you being seduced by worldliness?

- Love requires contact. The poor and rich need each other in more than financial exchange. You need their presence.
- Consider what the poor really require—the truth, friendship, employment.
