What good is it for a man to gain the whole world, and yet lose or forfeit his very self?"

• It means to give God everything you have and depend on him for everything you need. (Luke 21:1-4)

• Its means you prioritize the pursuit of righteousness over the pursuit of material things. (Luke 12:22-34)

• It means you reject the common notion that life is about building up an abundance of wealth and afterward taking life easy to enjoy it. (Luke 12:14-21)

• It means to forgive those who sin against you. (Luke 17:1-4)

• It means you have to incur opposition from society. (Luke 13:14)

• It means you learn not to be afraid of physical death (Luke 12:4-7)
