Matthew 10:8

Freely you have received, freely give.

1. A Steward must be vigilant against greed and covetousness.

"Watch and Be vigilant against all/all kinds of greed/covetousness." — Luke 12:15

What did the Rich man do wrong?

Not

- Simply be rich
- Make a lot of profit through competence or good fortune

Did

- Calls everything "mine"
- Keeps everything
- Rejects productivity

Luke 12:21

"This is how it will be with **anyone** who stores up things for himself but is not rich toward God."

Greed and covetousness are a *rejection* of stewardship

because they are the **reversal** of stewardship

Greed

"I must own everything, and must govern nothing."

(for Covetousness, change "must" to "should")

Steward

"I own nothing, but govern everything."

2. A Steward must face her materialistic anxieties

All of our true worry assumes we are responsible where God is to care for us, and assumes God will not do it.

Jesus: You cannot believe this lie!

It leads to covetousness, not faith.

greed entitlement complacency generosity risk love

Remember:

Jesus and the Bible do not present FA as the opposite of REASON, but as

the alternative to FEAR.

(Here he is appealing to reason to help us overcome fear with faith. Fear produces irrationality.)

3. A steward must have faith in true wealth

If a steward is an investor, he must care about wealth, flourishing and value. This is why faith in Jesus and his kingdom is necessary for good stewardship. It defines true value.

Or: "Your treasure is what you treasure."

Luke 12:28-34

1

O you of little faith! And do not <u>set your heart</u> on what you will eat or drink; <u>do not worry</u> about it. For the pagan world runs after all such things, and your Father knows that you need them. But <u>seek</u> his kingdom, and these things will be given to you as well. "Do not be afraid, little flock, for your Father has been pleased to give you the kingdom. Sell your possessions and give to the poor. Provide purses for yourselves that will not wear out, a treasure in heaven that will not be exhausted, where no thief comes near and no moth destroys. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.
