...in Christ


1. God is "blessed" or adored.

Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in the heavenly realms with every spiritual blessing in Christ.

This is the application of the first 14 verses (and more).


We are prone to being negativity machines.

Ephesians 6:19-20

Pray also for me, that whenever I open my mouth, words may be given me so that I will fearlessly make known the mystery of the gospel, for which I am an ambassador in chains. Pray that I may declare it fearlessly, as I should.



2. God has given us every spiritual blessing.

Ephesians 1:3
Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in the heavenly realms with every spiritual blessing in Christ.

3. God predestined us.

Ephesians 1:4-6
For he chose us in him before the creation of the world to be holy and blameless in his sight. In love he predestined us to be adopted as his sons through Jesus Christ, in accordance with his pleasure and will—to the praise of his glorious grace, which he has freely given us in the One he loves.

What we know about election:

- 1. He tells us that it happens that God chose us before the creation of the world.
- 2. He tells us its purpose so we could be holy and blameless in his sight, for his glory.
- 3. <u>He tells us his means</u> in Christ, through Christ.
- 4. He tells us his motivation- in accordance with his pleasure and will.

God's functional purpose in election:

- 1. For his glory God takes credit for his actions.
- 2. <u>Against boasting</u> to take pride in our predestination would be like taking pride in the color of our eyes, or the place of our birth.

4. God saves graciously

Ephesians 1:5-6
he predestined us to be adopted as his
sons through Jesus Christ, in accordance
with his pleasure and will-- to the praise
of his glorious grace, which he has freely
(graciously) given us in the One he loves.

Grace the word that means everything and does nothing for us emotionally.

Grace is

everything God gives us that we do not have a claim to,

which is basically everything.

Romans 8:30-32
