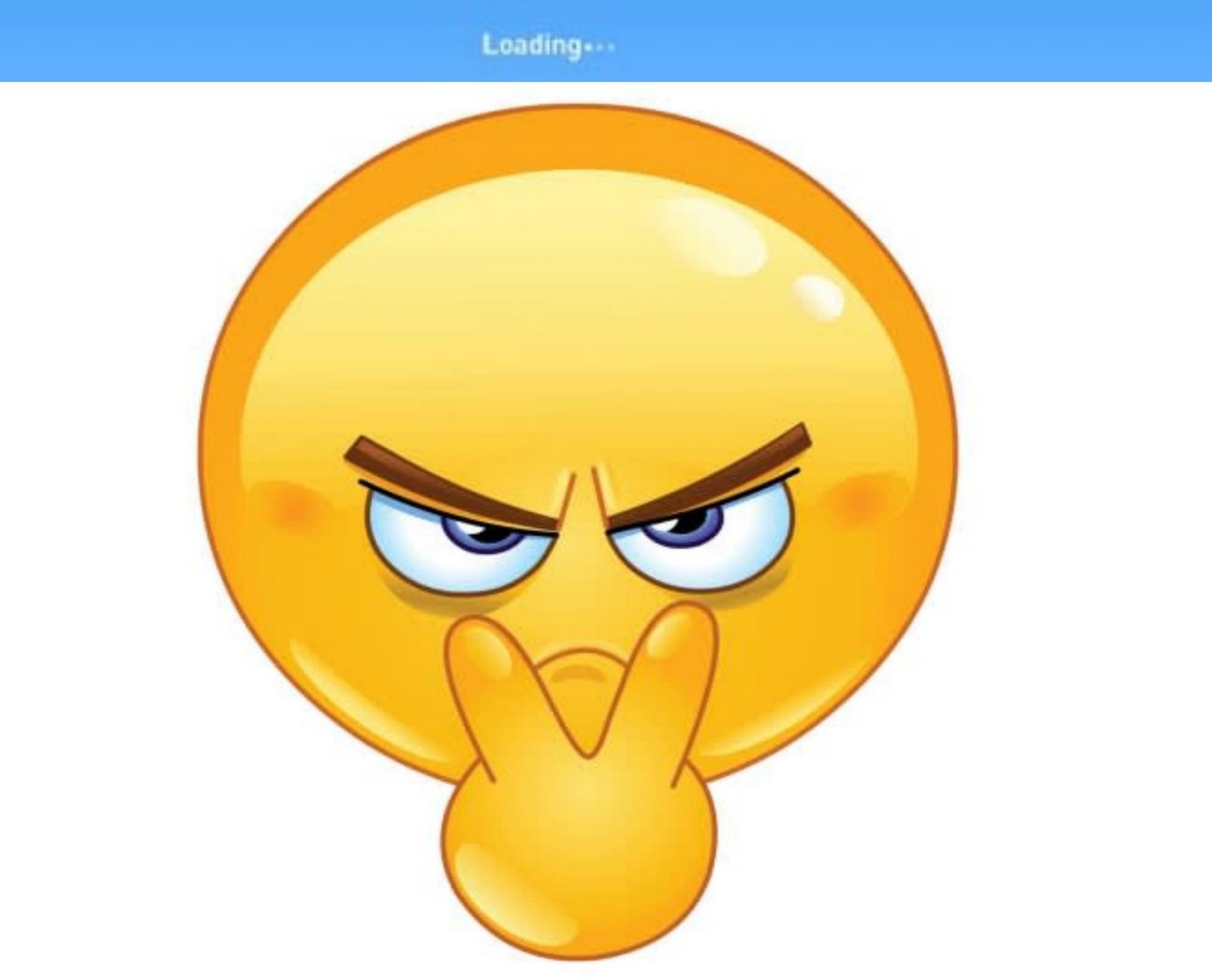




There is competition for our attention

HPC language:

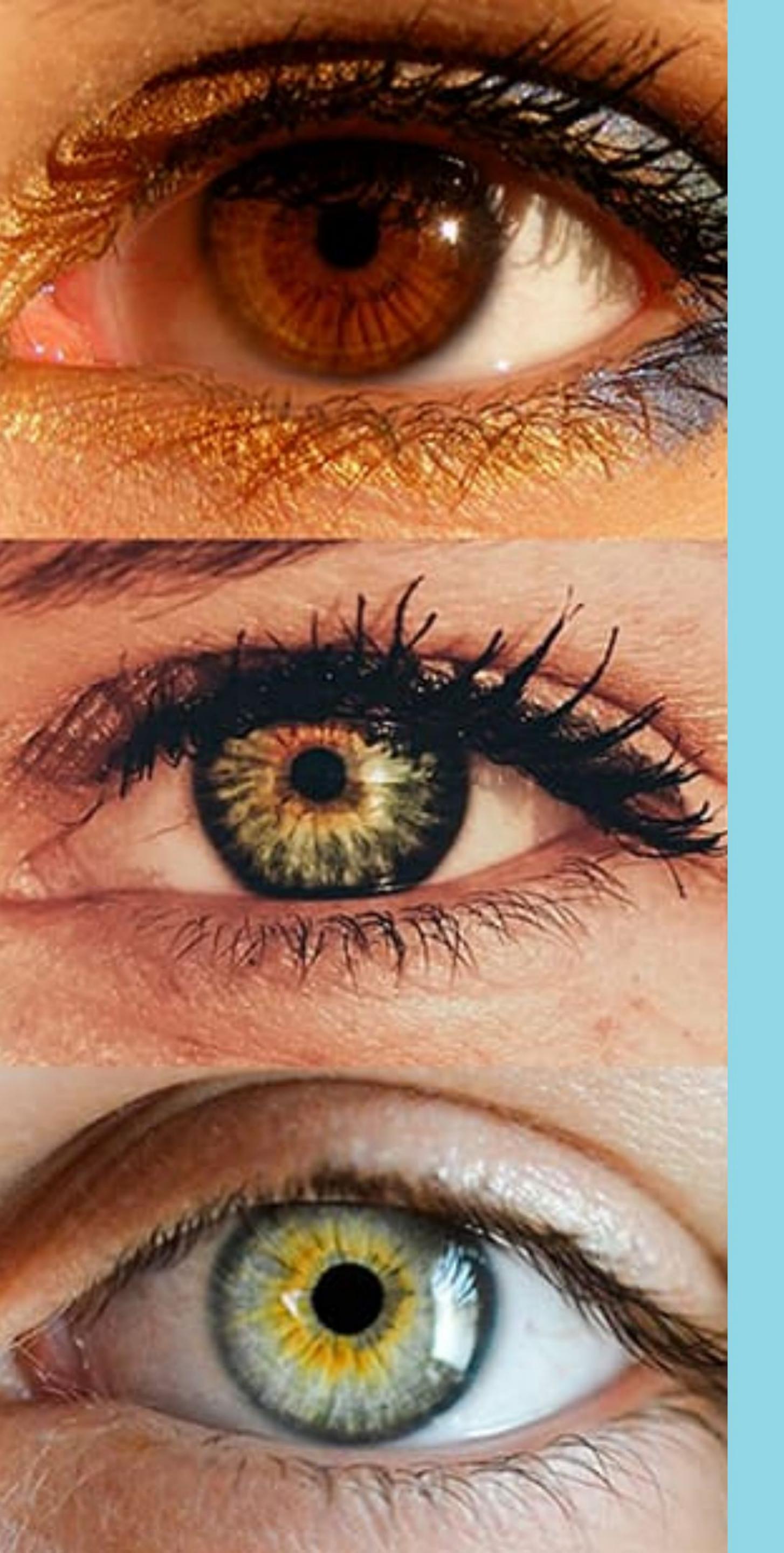
Escape diversion, embrace discipline.

We have to do the negative work of escaping and eliminating distractions and out of place amusement.

We have to actively give ourselves to the right things.
We have to discipline our attention.

You must do the positive AND the negative.

We're prayed for to be able to see them:

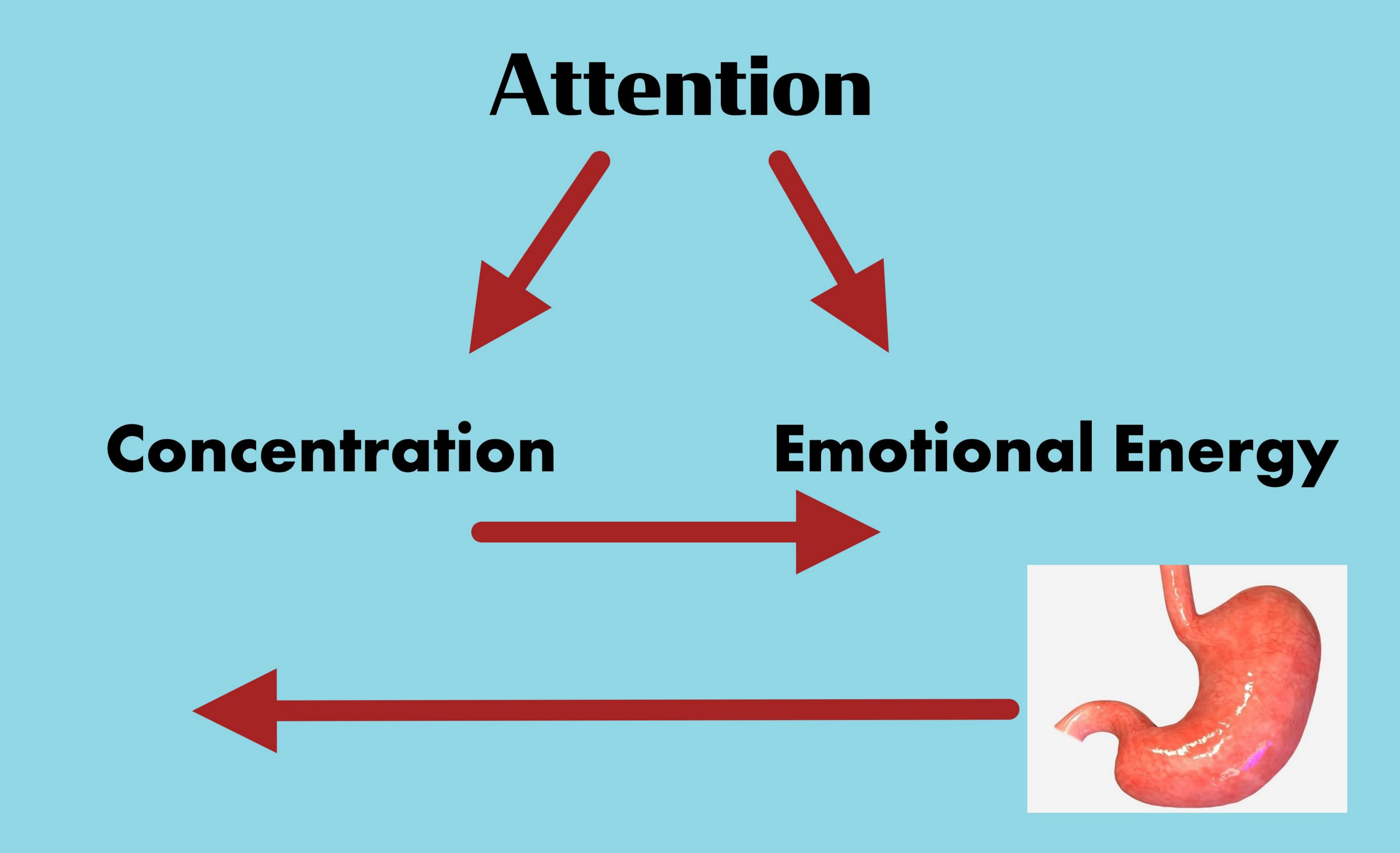
1:15 – 23, 3:14 – 21

Not just an intellectual process:

Colossians 3 – "set your hearts...set your mind..."

Ephesians 1:1 – 14 — an argument that is supposed to make you feel.

"Blessed be...to the praise of his glory." (1a, 14b)



How do we do this? By doing things that put our attention in contact with spiritual truths and God himself.

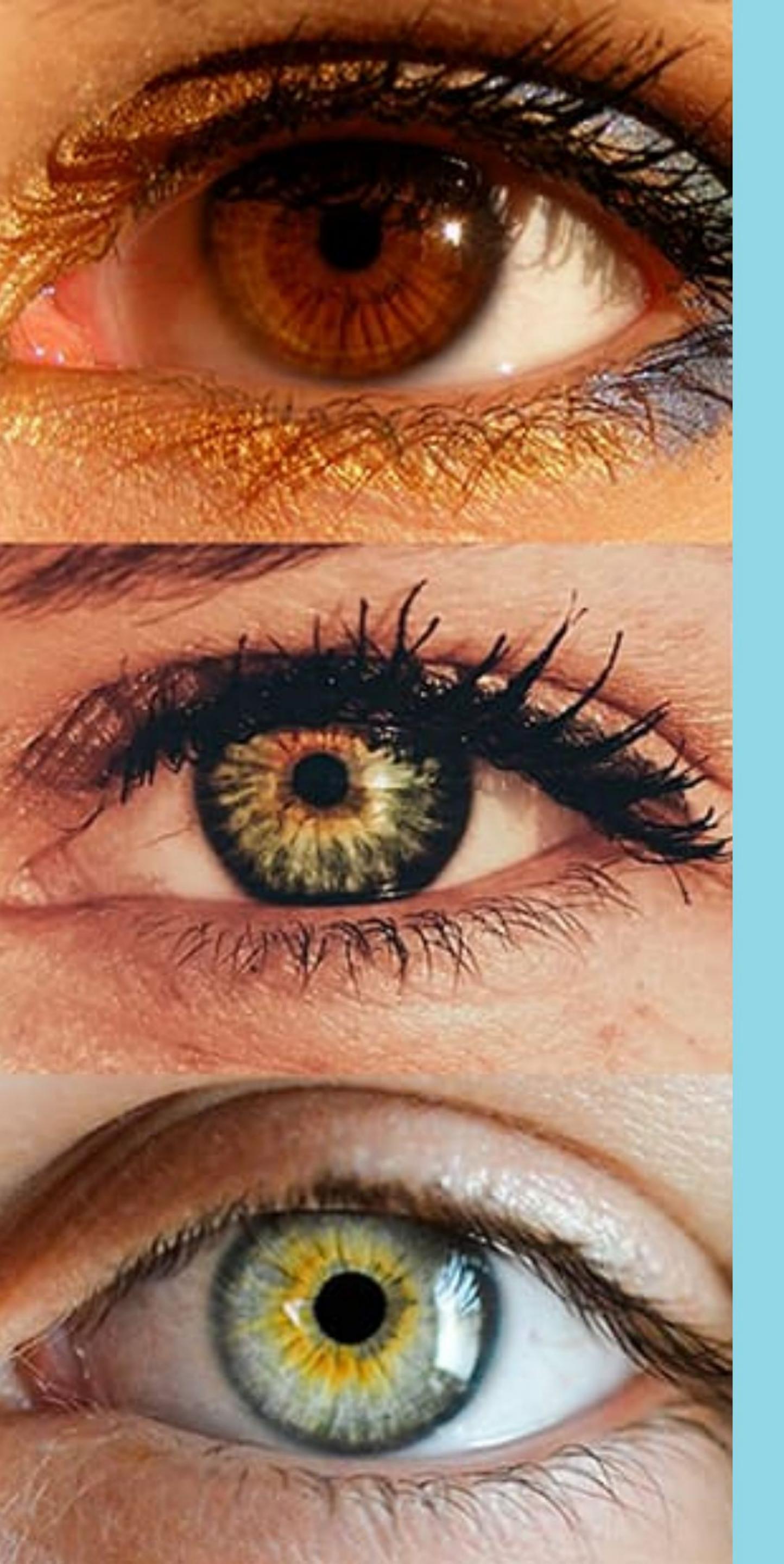
1. Rhythms2. Rituals

3 groups to give disciplined attention:

- 1. Fellowship: Those God has given to strengthen2. Unity / Solidarity: Those with whom
- 2. Unity/Solidarity: Those with whom he has made you one
 3. Hospitality: Those he has placed
- 3. Hospitality: Those he has placed close to you

Fellowship God has put us together to care for and strengthen each other.

This is the main theme of chapters 4 - 5.

"The hierarchy of the Golden 9 minutes"

The Golden 9 Minutes - The maximum amount of time you have to initiate a conversation with new, unconnected, and especially non-majority person.

First 2 minutes are key

Initiating the convo:

2 Questions:

1. "How long have you been attending High Point?"



2. "Can we do introductions again?"

Ask two questions. Ask a third if they seem into it.
