3:10, He has given us the mission as the church to display his wisdom in the word.

3:17 – 19, He has rooted and established us in his immeasurable love, a love that we comprehend more and more as we serve him.

Ephesians 6:4 – 6

There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to one hope when you were called; one Lord, one faith, one baptism; one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all.

One Body (4) – The body of Christ which every believer is a member of after being placed there at conversion by the Holy Spirit.

One Spirit (4) - The same Holy Spirit indwells each believer. Our physical DNA is not identical but our spiritual DNA absolutely is. We have the same Spirit and belong to each other in the Lord.

One hope when you were called (4) -This refers to the return of the Lord to take His Church to heaven. The Holy Spirit in us is the assurance of this great promise.

One Lord (5) – This is our Lord Jesus Christ who died for us, lives for us, and one day will come for us. If two believers claim to believe the same Lord, they should be able to walk together in unity.

One faith (5) - There is one settled body of truth deposited by Christ in His Church. Jude calls it "the faith that was once for all entrusted to God's holy people" (Jude 3).

One baptism (5) – The water baptism when a person identifies themself with the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Unity is based on our common beliefs. One God the Father of all (6) - The marvelous oneness of believers in the family of God is evident here, for God is over all, and working through all, and in all. We are children in the same family, loving and serving each other and the same Father so we ought to be able to live together in unity.
