







"I don't do for kids what they can do for themselves."

2. Jesus has given leaders to equip the saints

NIV Ephesians 4:11
"So Christ himself gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the pastors and teachers..."

The Apostles...

An apostle is one who is sent to do a work or teach content, and is distinguished from a disciple, who is a learner. The NT has THE Apostles, and other references to 'apostles'.

Romans 16:7 Greet Andronicus and Junias, my relatives who have been in prison with me. They are *outstanding among the apostles*, and they were in Christ before I was. (NIV82)

"The apostles..."

(NIV82) 1 Corinthians 9:2
"Even though I may not be an apostle to others, surely I am to you! For you are the seal of my apostleship in the Lord."

(NIV82) 2 Corinthians 11:13 "For such men are false apostles, deceitful workmen, masquerading as apostles of Christ."

The Prophets

"Speaking words that God leads (intuitionally) into the immediate moment that can be distinguished from teaching, which is the stewardship and reapplication of previous knowledge (deliberation)."

(Scripture has a number of women as examples in the prophetic office—ex. All 4 of Phillip's daughters. Acts 21:9)

Evangelists

Someone who is gifted and specialized in the clear description, bold proclamation, and wise defense of the Gospel.

Who Equips the saints
Remember, these are people who equip us.

Pastors and Teachers Or: Pastor-teachers

'Pastor' is the old English for 'shepherd'

A teacher transmits and explains truths in the context of wisdom to promote wholistic understanding

Why These 5? The "5 Fold Ministry"?

Developing these ideas is worth doing.

But why these 5 gifts? (Since they are NOT the NT's form of governance.)

My View:

Itinerancy—Works that are not rooted long term in one place, but move from place to place supporting different locations.

3. Jesus has given his saints the ability to build up The Body.

Ephesians 4:16 "...from whom (Christ) the whole body, being fitted and held together, through every ligament of provision, according to the working power, in the measure of each individual part, makes the body grow, building up of itself in love." (NIC literal translation)

So what do I do with this?

(Some ideas...but you can think for yourself and in spiritual conversation with others and come up with something approximating a million possible applications if you choose to open your heart to the Spirit and the wisdom of the scriptures and really seek to exhert faith in obedience.)

1. This all assumes you are imbedded in the local church.

2. You have to believe in multi-causation.

Thinking only: "Did God do that?" or praying only, "God do this." isn't a very Biblical way of thinking about how God works.

3. Spiritual Leadership is critically important

(The church tends to do about as well as it is led.)

- Love and support your spiritual leaders
- Honor their sacrifices
- Take selection and training seriously
- Encourage the desire to do the work

4. You have the ability to build yourselves up in unity and maturity.

(Experts are a better seasoning than meal in any community. Don't let any community revolve around them. You are qualified to serve others.)

5. You have to obey God's methods to get his transforming results.

God's multi-causes are interdependent. It is an unhackable code. Try to hack it and you'll corrupt it.
