





Do not get drunk on wine, which leads to debauchery.







#### The Pauline Paradox

The Christian life is both a time of:

- 1. Diligence in warfare
- 2. Joyfulness in worship

Christians are to live prepared for war and Christians are called to be joyful.

#### Joyfulness in Worship

Ephesians 5:18b-20 Be filled with the Spirit speaking to one another with psalms, hymns, and songs from the Spirit. Sing and make music in your heart to the Lord. Always giving thanks to God the Father for everything, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

#### Joyfulness in Worship

Joyfulness in worship, the singing of songs of praise to God out of a heart of love and the giving of thanks to God are the result of being filled with the Spirit.

## Joyfulness in Worship How can I obey the command to be filled with the Spirit?

- 1. Be indwelled by the Spirit. (Ephesians 1:13)
  - 2. Live in obedience to what the Spirit desires. (Romans 6:3-4,11 and 8:12)
  - 3. Produce the fruit of the Spirit (Gal. 6:22)
- 4. Sing songs of praise to one another and give God thanks for everything. (Ephesians 5:19–20)

#### Joyfulness in Worship

How can I obey the command to be filled with the Spirit?


To be filled with the Spirit as a way of life we need to experience God mentally (I know what the Word says), physically (I do what the word says), emotionally (I experience the joy of worship and thanksgiving).

#### Joyfulness

We are to "sing and make music from the heart to the Lord."

"With your heart" signifies that you mean it and that you feel it.

This is where our joy comes from. The essence of Christian worship and peace is an inner, authentic valuing of God in the heart.


## Living the Christian life requires both vigilance and joyfulness.
