Ephesians 5:1 - 2 Follow God's example, therefore, as dearly loved children and walk in the way of love, just as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us as a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God.

Before we are ever to be husband and wife, we are brothers and sisters in Christ.

Marriage is meant to be a reflection of God's promises to us, that we would each lay down our own life, as Christ did for each sinful person, and serve the other as they find the fullness of Christ in their life and then live it out in community with their spouse and potentially children.

- 1:18 I pray that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened in order that you may know the hope to which he has called you, the riches of his glorious inheritance in his holy people
- 2:4 But because of his great love for us, God, who is rich in mercy
- 3:16 I pray that out of his glorious riches he may strengthen you with power through his Spirit in your inner being
- 5:21 Submit to one another out of reverence for Christ.

Submit to one another because that is the way of the Kingdom of God.

Men, our headship should reflect Christ and his love for the church thereby making the marriage and home the most secure, trustworthy and affectionate place a person could possibly be.


Functional vs. Hierarchical
