Fathers, do not exasperate your children; instead, bring them up in the training and instruction of the Lord.






1. It's right for children to obey their parents.

"Honour your father and mother"


2. Obedience has promise for good—" "the first command with a promise."

1. "Bring them up"—Nourish and Nurture

NIV Ephesians 5:29 "After all, no one ever hated their own body, but they feed and care for their body, just as Christ does the church..."

NAS Ephesians 5:29 "For no one ever hated his own flesh, but nourishes and cherishes it, just as Christ also does the church..."

2. "Don't provoke" your children.

Don't underestimate how much you resent your kids or you won't know you're provoking them.

Provoke - "Tempt someone through negative emotion to do something destructive."




3. "Training and Admonition"

The goal is their honorable <u>adulthood</u>.

Training: the experiential mastery of a set of abilities.

Admonition: "To counsel about the avoidance or cessation of an improper course of conduct."


"Provoke" vs. "Admonition"

To become themselves, like Christ, through our influence.






