


Isn't Jesus a man of PEACE?

his favor rests."




Isaiah 9:6 NIV


Matthew 5:9 NIV Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God.


For as in the day of Midian's defeat, you have shattered the yoke that burdens them, the bar across their shoulders, the rod of their oppressor.


Matthew 8, Mark 4, Luke 8

...a man with an impure spirit came from the tombs to meet him...lived in the tombs, and no one could bind him anymore, not even with a chain...No one was strong enough to subdue him. Night and day among the tombs and in the hills he would cry out and cut himself with stones...



Mk. 5:6–10 ...he saw Jesus from a distance, he ran and fell on his knees in front of him. He shouted at the top of his voice, "What do you want with me, Jesus, Son of the Most High God? In God's name don't torture me!" For Jesus had said to

him, "Come out of this man, you impure THE GADARENE spirit!" Then Jesus asked him, "What is your name?" "My name is Legion," he replied, "for we are many." And he begged Jesus again and again not to send them out of the area.



What does this have to do with Ephesians 6:13?

"Therefore put on the full armor of God, so that when the day of evil comes, you may be able to stand your ground, and after you have done everything, to stand."

Jesus' life was full of these kind of "stands"

The Gaderene Satan in the Desert (Lk 4) Attack on his mission (Mk 2-3, Mt 16, Mk 8) Hypocritical Religion (Mt 23) Corruption in worship (Jn 2) His crucifixion and death

God's plan is for you to Stand. to take a stand, to make a stand, and to end standing.

Like Jesus the incarnate warrior.

However, we are only given one way how:

"Put on the full armor of God."

We should stand by putting on the full armor of God.



1. Our spiritual life amounts to taking a stand



4 "stands" in the passage:

Take a stand – deciding to fight

Able to stand – doing the fighting

Still standing – being standing after the fight


Armoring up – preparing by putting on
the armaments supplied by God.

"Conflict Realism"

against the 'Devil's' (hasatan) schemes (vs 11)

'flaming arrows of the evil one' (vs 16)

'Day of Evil' (vs 13)



Jesus had conflict realism...

He knew he was fighting the Devil—not men

He expected deceptive, non-direct warfare that entangled civilians.

He expected a long and terrible fight.



We need conflict realism...

We know we are fighting Devils—not men

We expect deceptive, non-direct warfare that entangles civilians.

We expect a long and terrible fight.



We should stand by putting on the full armor of God.

Everything should be structured for perseverance.



2. We can only make that stand with the full armor of God




Eph. 6:10–14 NIV

Finally, be strong in the Lord and in his mighty power. Put on the full armor of God, so that you can take your stand against the devil's schemes... Therefore put on the full armor of God, so that when the day of evil comes, you may be able to stand your ground, and after you have done everything, to stand. Stand firm then...

2 alternatives:

God could have made us fight for ourselves.


You could decide to fight on your own.
