It Is We Humans He Helps

The angels are his helpers, not the ones he helps.

3 words that unlock 3 key ways he helps us

1. Jesus <u>tasted</u> death for everyone

Hebrews 2:9

But we do see Jesus, who was made lower than the angels for a little while, now crowned with glory and honor because he suffered death, so that by the grace of God he might taste death for everyone.

Hebrews 2:10

Hebrews 12:1 - 2

And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith.

"Tasted death"

Pioneered the way through it.

1. Broke the power of judgment through atonement

2. In conquering its questions through resurrection

2. Suffering made Jesus the <u>perfect</u> savior for us.

Perfect

"Perfect" or "perfect for"

Hebrews 2:10 - 14

"In bringing many sons and daughters to glory, it was fitting [that] (to) God, for whom and through whom everything exists, should make the pioneer of their salvation perfect through what he suffered. Both the one who makes people holy and those who are made holy are of the same family.
