1. CONVERSION

1 Thessalonians 1:9 – 10

"...They tell how you turned to God from idols to serve the living and true God, and to wait for his Son from heaven, whom he raised from the dead—Jesus, who rescues us from the coming wrath."

CONVERSION

The full change (turning) of mind and heart from idols to serve the living and true God, and to wait for his Son from heaven.

"CONVERSION" IS A CONDESCENSION WORD.

Conversion is really the opposite of bigotry.

DEFINITIONS

Conversion: The full change of mind based on persuasive evidence warranting a change.

Bigotry: Refusal to change one's mind after persuasive evidence warrants believing your previous conclusions were prejudicial.

reorienting to God in worship



CONVERSION'S COMPONENTS

- 1. Full change—Repentance and faith
- 2. Gospel—The truths we put our faith in
- 3. Regeneration—God's work in us
- 4. The Holy Spirit—God with us

BEING MADE NEW

John 3 - "must be born again" Eph. 2 - "God made you alive" 2 Corinthians 5 - "a new creation" Ezekiel 37 - "dry bones" live Romans 6 - "buried" and "raised" Titus 3:5 - "regeneration" Ezekiel 11:19, 36:26 - Heart of "stone" to "flesh"

All PASSIVE to the human believer.

IMITATING CHRIST'S EXAMPLES IN CONVERSION

Conversion is a noble recognition that we were wrong (idolaters) and want to turn to the God who is both living and true. And serve him.

2. WORSHIP

The moment of conversion leads to ongoing worship because conversion turns us away from idols and produces joy.

GOD AND NOT IDOLS

1 Thessalonians 1:9 — 10

WELCOMING WITH JOY, IN SPITE OF AFFLICTION.

Joy is the wide universal, sadness is the narrow particular.

1 Thessalonians 1:6

2 CORINTHIANS 4:16 - 18

Therefore we do not lose heart. Though outwardly we are wasting away, yet inwardly we are being renewed day by day. For our light and momentary troubles are achieving for us an eternal glory that far outweighs them all. So we fix our eyes not on what is seen, but on what is unseen. For what is seen is temporary, but what is unseen is eternal.
