Under the curse, nothing flourishes without sacrifice.







Sacrifice (Sacrificial Service)

We are becoming a community for others. Sacrificial generosity (of time, risk, and resources) is the result of gospel motivation and the price of influence. Therefore, sacrifice is necessary in order to make the gospel believable to many who are skeptical, and to accomplish the work of ministries that save lives and save souls Christ sacrificed his own life to save. Sacrifice is the currency of love.

1. Someone has to choose to make sacrifices

Nehemiah 11:1 "Now the leaders of the people lived in Jerusalem. And the rest of the people cast lots to bring one out of ten to live in Jerusalem..."



2. Be thankful and respectful of the sacrifices of all

Nehemiah 11:2 "And the people blessed all the men who willingly offered to live in Jerusalem."



1 Thess. 5:12 - 13 NIV


