Unity is a vision.

Our practices make it a reality.

Philippians 1:27

"Whatever happens, conduct yourselves in a manner worthy of the gospel of Christ. Then, whether I come and see you or only hear about you in my absence, I will know that you stand firm in the one Spirit, striving together as one for the faith of the gospel"

If you want unity, give up.

(Unity isn't impossible, but it isn't free.)

If you want unity, practice humility.

The humility principle

Give up what's yours.

Philippians 2:1 – 2

Therefore if you have any encouragement from being united with Christ, if any comfort from his love, if any common sharing in the Spirit, if any tenderness and compassion, then make my joy complete by being like-minded, having the same love, being one in spirit and of one mind.

Philippians 2:3 – 4

Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves, not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of the others.



A humble person seeks the good of others at his/her own expense.

A conceited person seeks his/her own good at the expense of others.

Humility will cost you. Conceit will cost those around you.



Philippians 2:5 – 8

In your relationships with one another, have the same mindset as Christ Jesus:

Who, being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be used to his own advantage...

Philippians 2:5 – 8

...rather, he made himself nothing by taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness. And being found in appearance as a man, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to death even death on a cross!

3 costly practices that sustain unity

1) Be quiet

Self-centered speech

Arguing = "I am right!"
