It wouldn't have done any good.


What do you want from me anyway?

It's too hard.


What's the use?

We are masters at avoiding the moral and spiritual responsibility that is part of being human.


Responsibility

10 – 11, 21 – 29: The people in Israel

12 - 20, 30 - 33: The Jews in Exile



Ezekiel 33:12

"Therefore, son of man, say to your countrymen, 'The righteousness of the righteous man will not save him when he disobeys, and the wickedness of the wicked man will not cause him to fall when he turns from it. The righteous man, if he sins, will not be allowed to live because of his former righteousness."

People and Watchmen


1 The Evasion of Despair and Gloom

"It's no use."


It is resigning to complaining inaction when a virtuous exersion is needed.

"...He will surely live..." verse 15




The Evasion of Spiteful Rage

Spite

"I bet you're thrilled to see me this way!"

The afflicted often indulge in moral reversal rather than repentance.



Ezekiel 33:11

"Say to them, 'As surely as I live, declares the Sovereign LORD, I take no pleasure in the death of the wicked, but rather that they turn from their ways and live. Turn! Turn from your evil ways! Why will you die, O house of Israel?"

3. The Evasion of Moral Fault Finding

Ezekiel 33:17 - 20


"Yet your countrymen say, 'The way of the Lord is not just.' But it is their way that is not just. If a righteous man turns from his righteousness and does evil, he will die for it. And if a wicked man turns away from his wickedness and does what is just and right, he will live by doing so. Yet, O house of Israel, you say, 'The way of the Lord is not just.' But I will judge each of you according to his own ways."

The Evasion of False Hearing

Ezekiel 33:31 - 32

My people come to you, as they usually do, and sit before you to listen to your words, but they do not put them into practice. With their mouths they express devotion, but their hearts are greedy for unjust gain. Indeed, to them you are nothing more than one who sings love songs with a beautiful voice and plays an instrument well, for they hear your words but do not put them into practice.
