Rendering our suffering vain and tragic.

Stings and victories are what's left over when a conflict is finished.

WHAT IS THE STING? WHO GETS THE VICTORY?

Hint: God thinks this is the biggest problem.

The sting of death makes sin's guilt permanent.

And so death "wins" as a destroyer.
