

Concord Humility Sacrifice



1. Concord

Real likeness of heart and mind that makes for productive unity, shared course, and productive cooperation. It is the spiritual sharing of hearts.

"Like-mindedness"

Philippians 2:2

"Then make my joy complete by being like-minded, having the same love, being one in spirit and mind."

"Like-mindedness" corruptions:

- Mirror-mindedness
- Closed-mindedness
- Open-mindedness

Philippians 2:3

"Do nothing out of <u>selfish ambition</u> or <u>vain conceit</u>. Rather, in <u>humility</u> reckon others above yourselves..."



Selfish Ambition

Rivalry, emotional disputes of status and position, selfishness in the context of open discord. (Philippians 1:17)

Gal 5:20: "Rivalries" next to: dissention, division; 2 Cor 12:20: "disputes"

James 3:13 - 4:1

Who is wise and understanding among you? By his good conduct let him show his works in the meekness of wisdom. But if you have bitter jealousy and selfish ambition in your hearts, do not boast and be false to the truth. This is not the wisdom that comes down from above, but is earthly, unspiritual, demonic...

James 3:13 - 4:1

...For where jealousy and selfish ambition exist, there will be disorder and every vile practice. But the wisdom from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, open to reason, full of mercy and good fruits, impartial and sincere. And a harvest of righteousness is sown in peace by those who make peace.

Power and ambition are good (They are part of creation.)

Therefore, they are prone to corruption and require the reform and vigilancy of virtue.

Humble Ambition is productive, cooperative, even competitive. It is the opposite of rivalry. Humble ambition acts justly in its ambitions. It takes neither unearned advantage, not undeserved disadvantage.

The Question:

What are you ambitious for? How should power be used? What is really worth the passion of our pursuits?

Jesus' answer: GLORY

John 17:4 - 5

I have brought you glory on earth by completing the work you gave me to do. And now, Father, glorify me in your presence with the glory I had with you before the world began.

e Humility Corruption: e False modesty

When humility means handsome people thinking themselves ugly and clever people thinking they are dumb, the opposite of humility is achieved: dishonesty and self-focus.

Screwtape, Letter 14



vain-glory conceit



Definition: Glory

That which enobles and pleases the heart having the limelight of attention. That which rightly attracts concentration, animates devotion, quickens admiration, and induces imitation.

Glory is the object of worship (and the purpose).

Vain Conceit

Inflated self-regard, Empty attentiveness, inordinate, misappropriated devotion.

"keno-doxa"- "empty glory" KJV: "Vain-glory"

Vain-glory

Giving the limelight of our attention to lesser objects. Allowing such

things to focus our concentration, excite our affection, animate our devotion, quicken our admiration, and induce our imitation.

Then pursuing joy, embracing the honesty and ambition of humility by seeking true glory, what do we do?

3. Sacrifice

Philippians 2:4

Each of you should look not only to your own interests, but also to the interests of others.



Service



Corruption: denial of our humanity (anti-sabbath)

Rejeciton: inordinate self-concern



How much do I serve?

Service involves self denial, but is not the denial of the self.

Negative context:

"should not look only to his own interests..."

We tend to naturally get wrapped up in our own interests.

How much do I serve? In joy and concord, mindful of humility, what is seeking true glory?

How much should I serve?

Cultivate joy and union with Christ, pursue concord of mind and harmoniousness in humility. See Christ and his good glory. And grow in love in depth of knowledge and insight...then do what love wants and joy demands.



"Love God, then do as you will; for the soul trained in love to God will do nothing to offend the one who is beloved"

Jesus: Emptied Unto Glory

Instead of leaving us to worship the empty, he emptied himself to show us the substance of what must be worshipped.

...who being in his very nature God...

emptied himself...therefore God

exalted him to the highest place...to the
glory of God the father...

Love and sacrifice Humility is the precondition of love, but only the the bowels of felt concern can motivate sacrifice- the highest human glory.
