

Philippians 3:3 – 4

"...we who are the circumcision, we who worship by the Spirit of God, who boast in Christ Jesus, and who put no confidence in the flesh—though I myself have reasons for such confidence. If anyone else thinks he has reasons to put confidence in the flesh, I have more..."

Moral reasons




"Righteousness"

Other things can: conflict with, dilute, confuse, divide, or distract from the basis of our confidence.




Confidence

- 2. Comparison
 What as compared to what?
- 3. Conformation

 How do I beCome what I've believed?




Our confidence is in belonging to Christ Jesus himself.

Everything else is a confidence liability




(Not bad, a liability)



Philippians 3:7 – 9

"But whatever was to my profit I now consider loss for the sake of Christ. What is more, I consider everything a loss compared to the surpassing greatness of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord, for whose sake I have lost all things. I consider them rubbish, that I may gain Christ and be found in him..."

Why so absolute? This consideration requires a very specific and focused comparision.



Philippians 3:8 (literary translation) "What is more, very much to the contrary, also, I myself consider everything to be a liability compared to the superiority of the knowledge of Christ Jesus my Lord, for whose sake I have lost all things. I consider them refuse, that I may gain Christ"

Confidence Comparisons There answers are all in this passage

- 1. Will I be committed to what is truly superior?
- 2. Will I really follow the truth and real wisdom?
- 3. Will I actually know God—as personally as I can know such a being?
- 4. Will I have a claim in belonging to God and what is his?

Confidence Comparisons

- 5. Will I, in the end, be God's—will I end up with him in the end?
- 6. Will I have a claim to be considered righteous, and actually be as righteous as I can be? Will I have followed the right image of righteousness?

Confidence Comparisons

7. Will I have the belonging in meaningful endeavors that create real pleasure, significance, meaning and legacy? The kind of friendship that is deeper than family, and do deeds I can be glad are my legacy forever?

Confidence Comparisons

8. Will I overcome my greatest enemies?

Death and judgment? Is there a way to live forever in glory—rather than extinction, as a zombie, or in deserved punishment?

2 main "superiors"

- 1. The Knowledge of Christ Jesus.
- 2. The Righteousness from God through the faithfulness of Jesus Christ.



Philippians 3:10 – 12

I want to know Christ and the power of his resurrection and the fellowship of sharing in his sufferings, becoming like him in his death, and so, somehow, to attain to the resurrection from the dead...

Philippians 3:10 – 12

Not that I have already obtained all this, or have already been made perfect, but I press on to take hold of that for which Christ Jesus took hold of me.
