


Assurance as demotivation










Worldly assurances demotivate human beings.







Not often improved by 'believing in something'.

Produces:

- 1. Nominalism: in name only
- 2. Zealotry: objectified/abstracted passion
- 3. Piety: deep affection that motivates good

Piety


Dishonesty

Worldly Assurance Demotivates Piety

Philippians 3:17 – 21

Join with others in following my example, brothers, and take note of those who live according to the pattern we gave you. For, as I have often told you before and now say again even with tears, many live as enemies of the cross of Christ. Their destiny is destruction, their god is their stomach, and their glory is in their shame. Their mind is on earthly things. But our citizenship is in heaven. And we eagerly await a Saviour from there, the Lord Jesus Christ, who, by the power that enables him to bring everything under his control, will transform our lowly bodies so that they will be like his glorious body.

How does this happen?


There is a way of believing that frees you to pursue the Flesh and World, and a kind that frees you from pursuit of them.


Justification Misused


Glorification Misused

Jesus rose so I would rise, and so I don't need ot worry about my mortality or the continued presence of indwelling sin. He'll take all that away later.

Gospel assurance can empower real piety

Justification and Glorification are for NOW

Philippians 3:12 – 15

Not that I have already obtained all this, or have already been made perfect, but I press on to take hold of that for which Christ Jesus took hold of me. Brothers, I do not consider myself yet to have taken hold of it. But one thing I do: Forgetting what is behind and straining towards what is ahead, I press on towards the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenwards in Christ Jesus. Salvation Is All One Thing






Adopted

Philippians 3:10 – 11

I want to know Christ and the power of his resurrection and the fellowship of sharing in his sufferings, becoming like him in his death, and so, somehow, to attain to the resurrection from the dead.

Justification and Glorification Push and Pull the Present.

Philippians 3:14
...win the prize for which
God has called me heavenwards
in Christ Jesus.

Philippians 3:8 – 9

I consider them rubbish, that I may gain Christ and be found in him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but that which is through faith in Christ—the righteousness that comes from God and is by faith.
