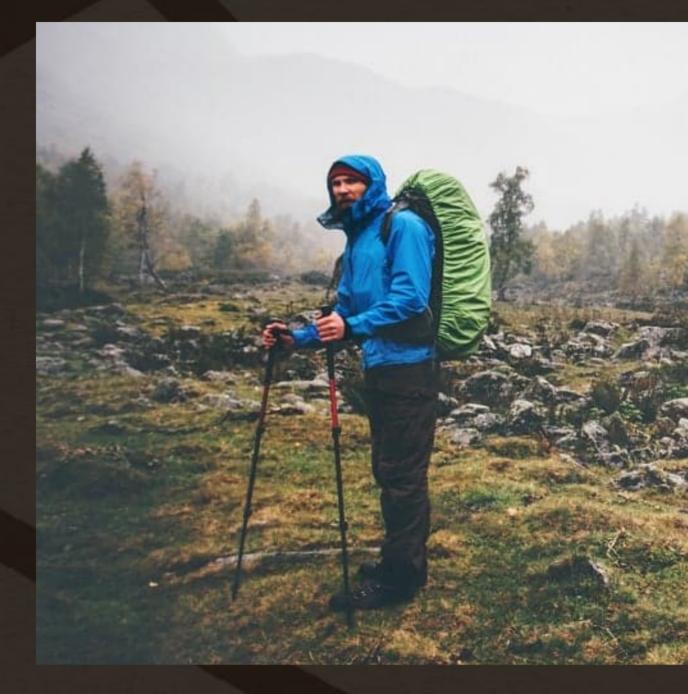
What happens when oneness crashes?

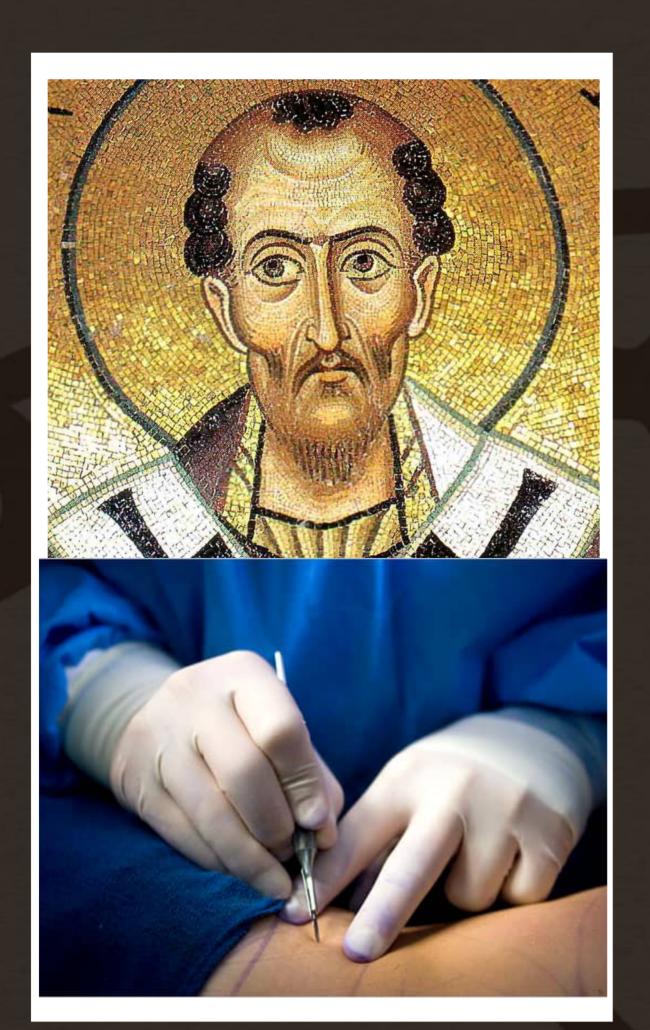

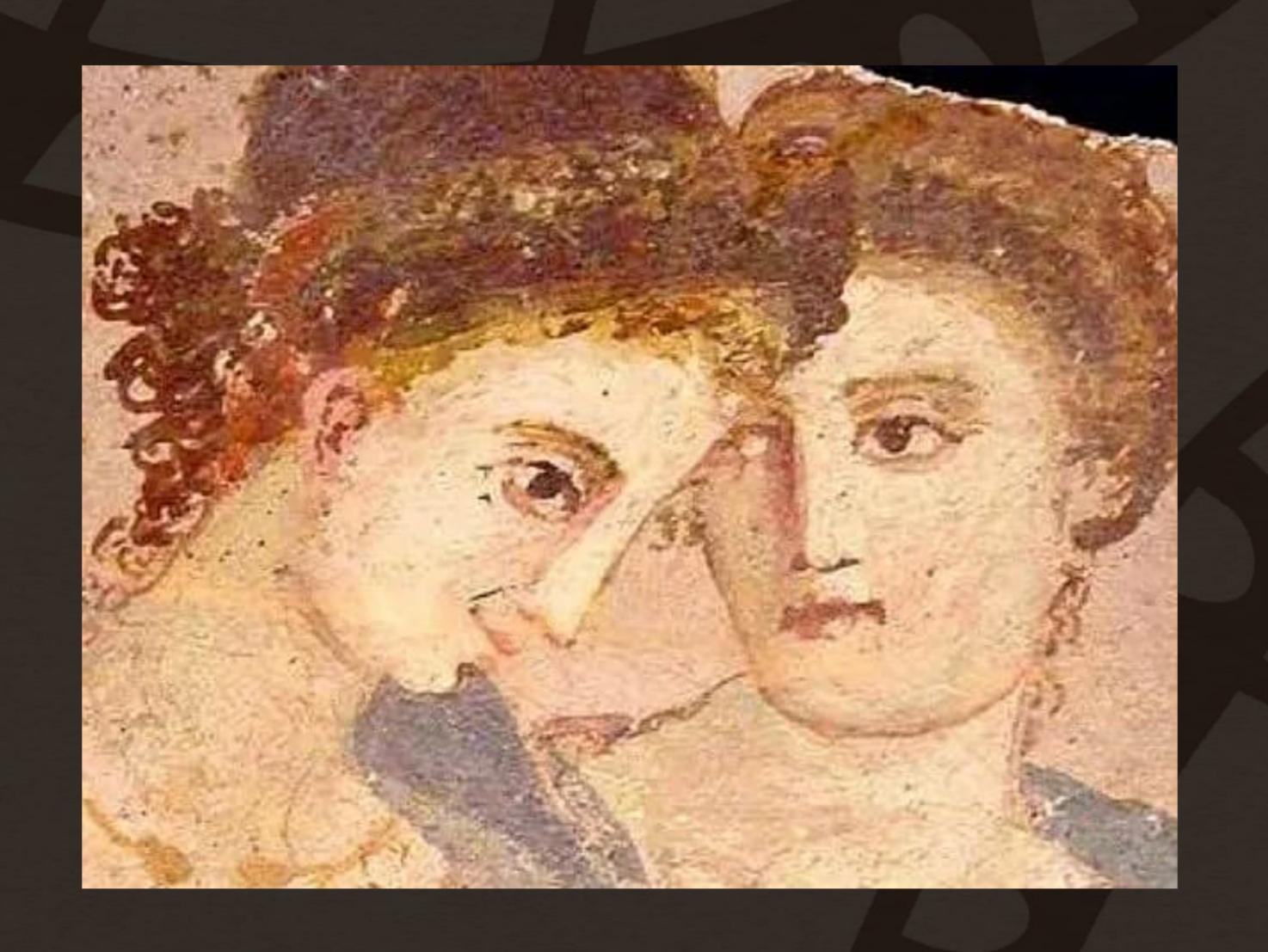

How do we pursue oneness, like mindedness, concord?

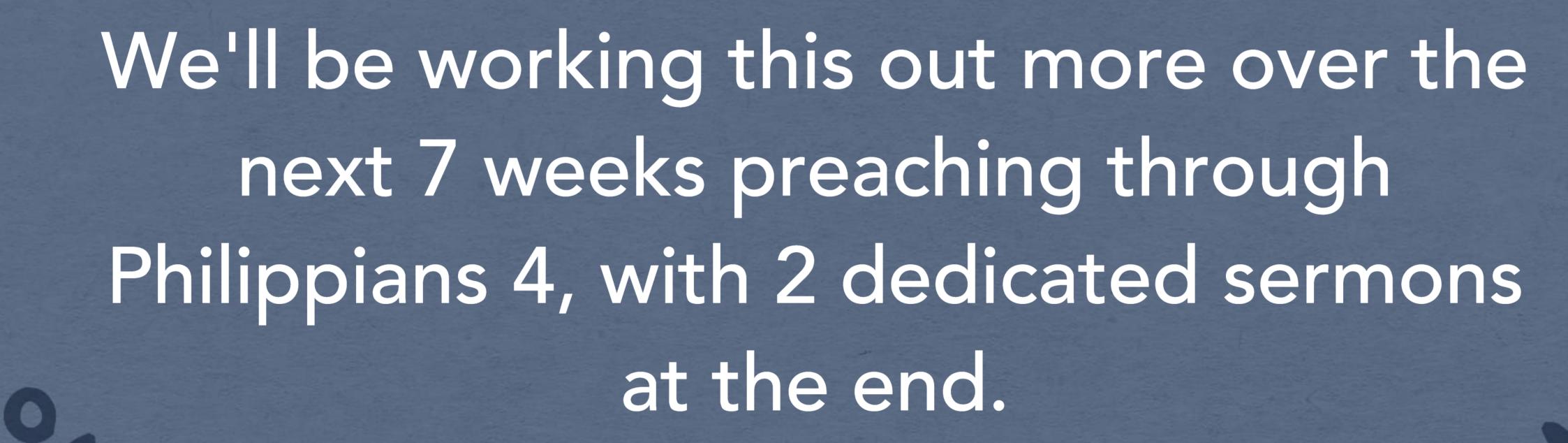
Is this boring?

A Summary



Active approach to conflict

Oneness is an achievement.
Resolving conflict produces less conflict.
Resolving conflict initiates growth.

Leaders must be resolvers

Elders and leaders have to have the courage and skill to resolve conflict.

We tear down dividing walls of hostility

Predictable human conflict is not inevitable in the church.

The church is a sign to the world.

Key "inters" - dividing walls

- Culture, traditions, history
