- ★ Time will be devoted to helping students navigate the naturalization process successfully— from understanding eligibility requirements to attending the naturalization ceremony.

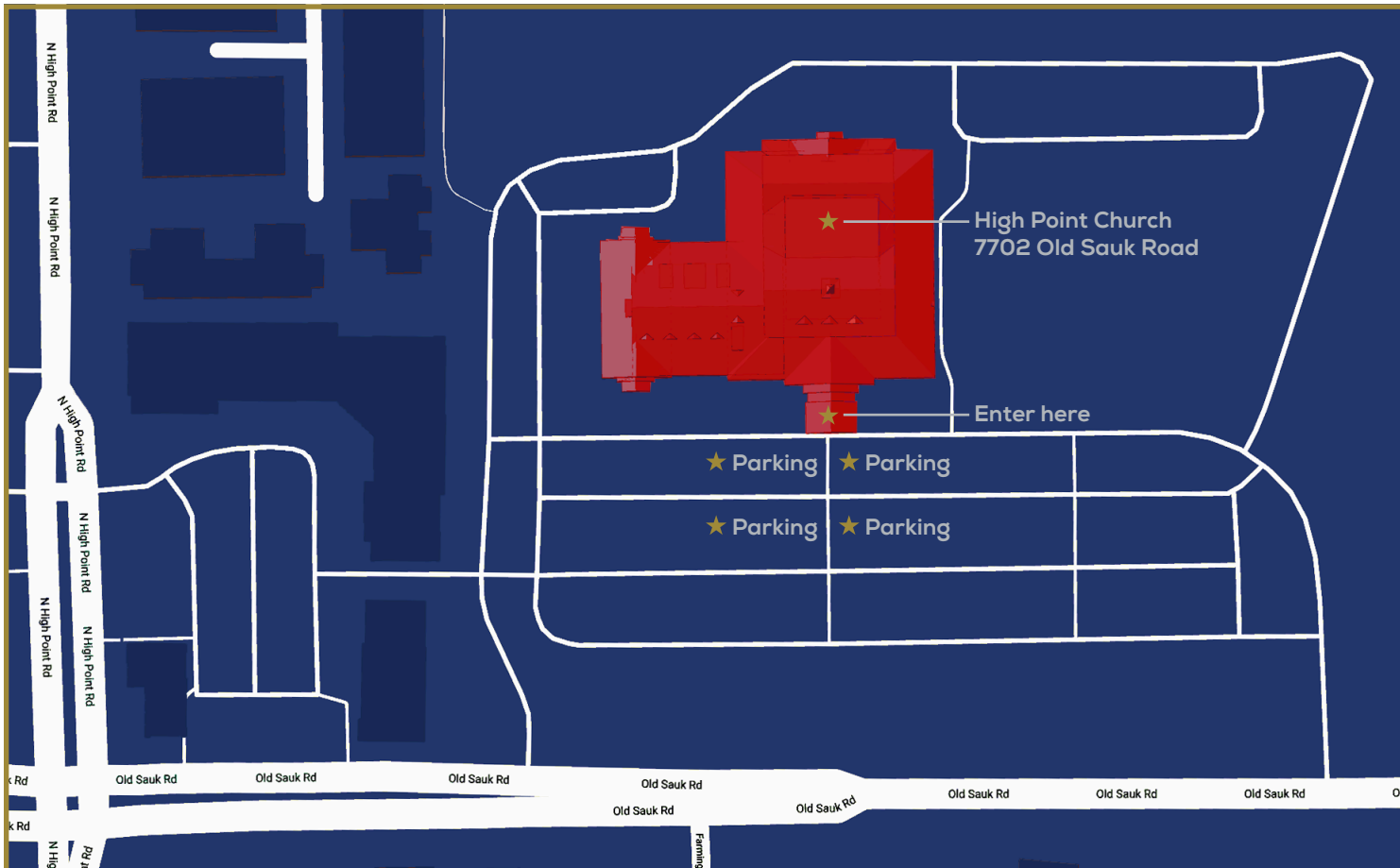
Class Objectives:
