




Tough seas are never comfortable.






2. Don't give up gospel ambitions

The Fear:





Gospel ambitions will endanger our other ambitions.

- Threats to our life and wealth
- Pleasure and security

Matthew 13:22 The worries of this life and the deceitfulness of wealth choke it, making it unfruitful.

This is true to the extent your ambitions are at odds with those of Jesus.

2 options:

- 1. Let the conflict sink you
- 2. Align your ambitions with Jesus







