
Sanctification - You can't become like 2 opposite masters

You cannot serve both God and Mammon..."


Serving life and death at the same time makes zombies.



Freedom is the ability to do the good.


Requires:

What is our Foundational Slavery? What are we saved FROM?


2 Peter 2:19 (see also 2 Pet 2:12)
They promise them freedom, while they
themselves are slaves of depravity—for a man is
a slave to whatever has mastered him.

Ephesians 2:1-5

Gracious Emancipation

All of us also lived among them at one time, gratifying the cravings of our Flesh and following its desires and thoughts. Like the rest, we were by nature objects of wrath. But because of his great love for us, God, who is rich in mercy, made us alive with Christ even when we were dead in transgressions—it is by grace you have been saved."

Ephesians 4:22-24

Freedom from the Law

Why is that the ultimate freedom?

(Why wouldn't we be saved FOR the Law?!?!?!?)

Galatians 5:1-6

It is for freedom that Christ has set us free. Stand firm, then, and do not let yourselves be burdened again by a yoke of slavery. Mark my words! I, Paul, tell you that if you let yourselves be circumcised, Christ will be of no value to you at all. Again I declare to every man who lets himself be circumcised that he is obligated to obey the whole law. You who are trying to be justified by law have been alienated from Christ; you have fallen away from grace. But by faith we eagerly await through the Spirit the righteousness for which we hope. For in Christ Jesus neither circumcision nor uncircumcision has any value. The only thing that counts is faith expressing itself through love. 2

Romans 8:1-4

Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus, **because** through Christ Jesus **the law of the Spirit of life set me free from the law of sin and death.** For what The Law was powerless to do in that it was weakened by the Flesh, God did by sending his own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh to be a sin offering. And so he condemned sin in the Flesh *in order that* the righteous requirements of the law might be fully met in us, who do not live according to the Flesh but according to the Spirit.

Freedom form the Law gives 2 freedoms:

1. Justification—(from legalism) freedom from moralism, hypocrisy, fear of death, and boasting (Eph 2:9, Rom 3:27, 4:2)

2. Sanctification—(from license) Freedom from the limitations the Law put on doing the good. Unleashing virtuous freedom

Humility

Thankfulness

Love

Conviction — Conscience

Sanctification - Faithful - Stewardship Virtuous

Genesis 1:26-28






